A proven business and government leader, Dave has a strong desire to ensure conservative principles are applied in City government. He has been influential in providing sound business and proven decision making skills to the council in dealing with notable issues facing Houston today. First elected in November 2012; public safety, fiscal responsibility and economic development have been and will continue to be cornerstone of Dave's daily priorities. Additionally, he works hard to ensure exemplary constituent service to the residents of District E. Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women

Many have not heard of Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women. It has been in existence since 1962 when it was organized as the Harris County Council of Federated Republican Women and later became known by its present name of Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women. As of 2019, Greater Houston Council (GHC) is made up of delegates from about 38 member clubs from Harris County and clubs from about 11 surrounding counties. Each club has two delegates with the president of each club being an automatic delegate; however, the meetings are open to anyone who wishes to attend. The board of directors is comprised of Republican women who are members of a member club. Our own Betsy Lake was president of Greater Houston Council from 1990-1991. GHC presents programs and speakers which keep Republican women informed of issues and matters of importance to the member clubs. A very informative and popular program which GHC presents every year is the Nuts N Bolts seminar which was begun by Betsy Lake many years ago. Nuts N Bolts presents various speakers knowledgeable in specific topics to help incoming officers from all the clubs in carrying out the duties of the offices to which they were elected or appointed. The seminar this year will be held on February 11 and is open to anyone who wishes to attend. This is an excellent opportunity to get informed and to meet Republican ladies from the various Republican women's clubs from Harris County and surrounding counties.
