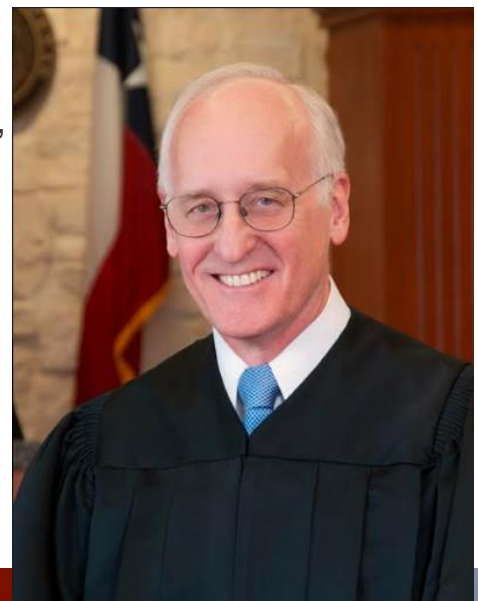
Michael Landrum holds specialist certifications in the fields of Civil Trial Law and Civil Appellate Law from the Texas Board of Legal Specialization.

Justice Lloyd's perspective on the bench is shaped by 40 years in the law, as a trial and appellate lawyer, prosecutor and judge. Russell was elected to the First Court of Appeals and began his service in 2015. He has adjudicated thousands of cases and authored more than 600 opinions. He previously served ten years as a district court judge where he presided over more than 300 jury trials.

Justice Lloyd served as a prosecutor in the Harris County District Attorney's Office and tried over 200 jury trials. He has decades of civil trial and appellate experience representing both plaintiffs and defendants in state and federal courts across the Nation. Russell attended The University of Texas School of Law and served as a briefing attorney at the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals.

Russell served in the military for 20 years in the active and reserve components. He is a Vietnam veteran, a Paratrooper, and officer in the Judge Advocate General's Corps. Justice Lloyd has been married for 35 years to Mary, an attorney and they have two children, also attorneys. A lifelong musician, Russell plays in community orchestras in the Houston area including the Fort Bend Symphony, Houston Sinfonietta and Houston Civic Symphony.



## Judge Elizabeth Lunceford

### Judge- 61<sup>st</sup> Civil District Court

Judge Erin Elizabeth Lunceford was appointed to the 61st Civil District Court by Governor Abbott on July 8, 2015. She took her oath of office on July 31, 2015, and served until January 1, 2017, defeated by the straight ticket sweep in 2016. During her 17 months on the bench Judge Lunceford presided over 30 jury trials (including trying the most jury trials of all the civil district judges in 2016) and prides herself in timely ruling on all outstanding motions and other matters pending in the 61st District Court.

When she left the bench to return to private practice, she had the lowest inventory of pending cases of all 24 Civil District Courts. Since leaving the bench, Judge Lunceford has practiced law with the global law firm, Norton Rose Fulbright, where she specializes in civil litigation, helps train young lawyers, and conducts mediations and arbitrations. Judge Lunceford has practiced civil trial law for 32 years, and has tried over 38 cases to jury verdict, and handled over 40 appeals, including successfully arguing to the Texas Supreme Court.

She is an elected member of the Board of the Houston Bar Association and has received the HBA President's Award for her work as co-chair of the 2015 Teach Texas Committee and as co-chair of the 2019 Bench Bar Committee. Judge Lunceford is a member of the American Board of Trial Advocates and is the immediate past president of the Houston Chapter. She is Board Certified in Personal Injury Trial Law and is also certified as a Medical Malpractice Specialist by the American Board of Professional Liability Attorneys.

Judge Lunceford graduated from the University of Colorado in Boulder in 1983 with a degree in Economics and received her J.D. from the University of Houston Law Center in 1988. She and her husband Michael, have been married for 36 years and have two grown children and 2 grandchildren.

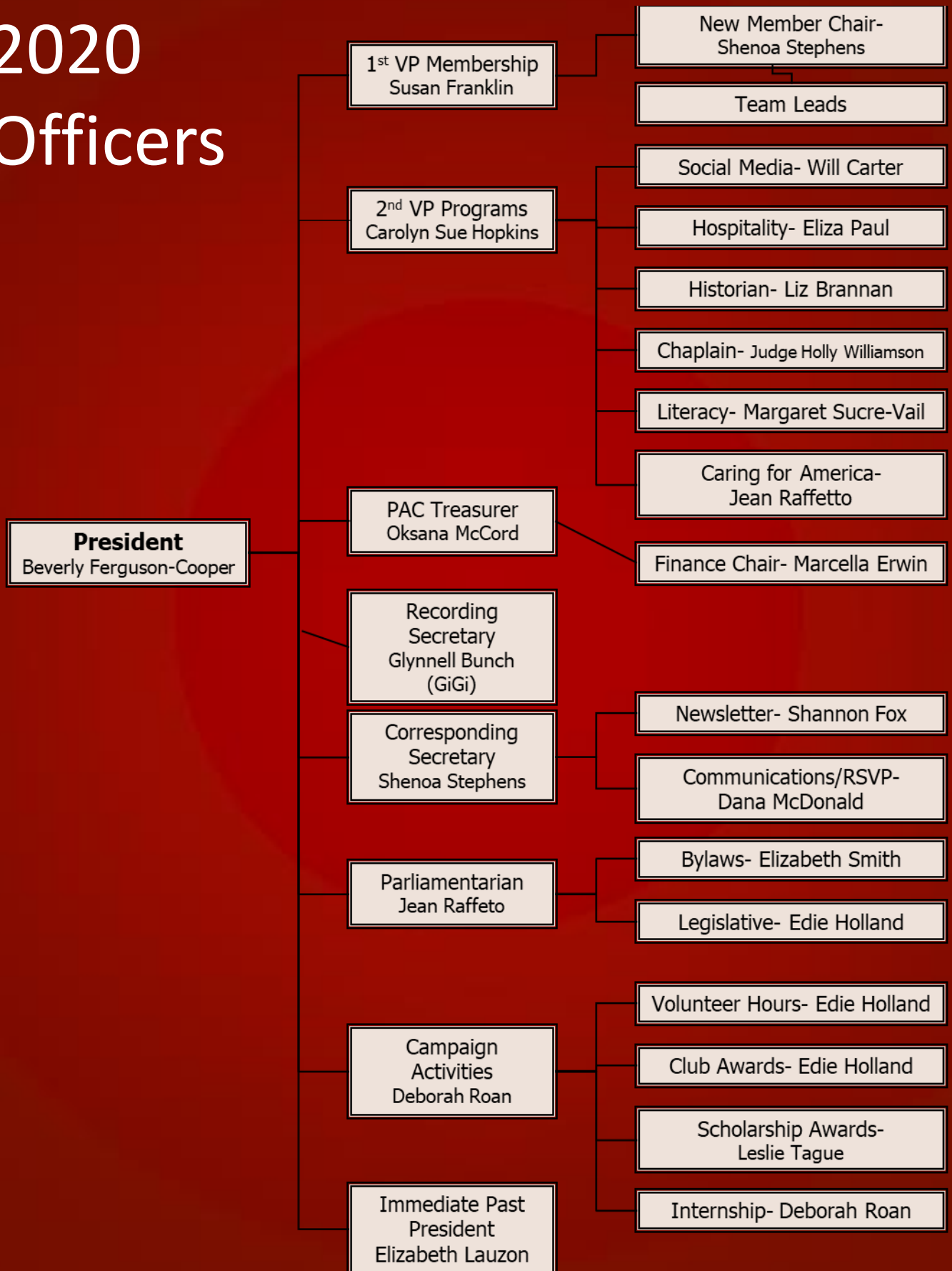
