President's Voice



Hello BARW,

We live in dangerous times. In searching my heart for this month's message, considering the events of the last few weeks, and thinking about what is going on in our country, I stumbled on this article in The Atlantic written by Adam J White in February 2020. It is a jewel in my opinion and is very apropos to our current situation.

The government set up by James Madison and the other Founders requires a virtuous public and virtuous leaders—or the whole system will fail.

On December 31, 2020, Chief Justice John Roberts sent his Annual Report on the work of the Federal Courts, in it he called on Federal Judges --and everyone else-- to invest themselves in the preservation of constitutional democracy.

"Each generation," he wrote, "has an obligation to pass on to the next, not only a fully functioning government responsive to the needs of the people, but the tools to understand and improve it." For Roberts, this requires civic education—and something more fundamental than that, too.

What does it take to "keep a republic"? Nearly two and a half centuries into this experiment in self-governance, Americans tend to think that they keep their republic by relying on constitutional structure: separated powers, federalism, checks and balances. But constitutional structure, like any structure, does not maintain itself. Each generation has to maintain its institutions and repair any damage that its predecessors inflicted or allowed. This task begins with civic education, so that Americans know how their government works, and thus what to expect from their constitutional institutions. Yet civic education alone, though necessary, is not sufficient. For civic education to take root and produce its desired fruit, the people themselves must have certain qualities of self-restraint, goodwill, and moderation. Because those virtues are necessary for the functioning of a constitutional republic, they are often called *civic virtue*, or *republican virtue*. However, civic virtue requires civility. Here the article also quotes Justice Gorsuch, in an era of fractured politics, the blessings of freedom come "with the duty of having to listen to and tolerate other points of view," because "democracy depends on our willingness, each one of us, to hear and respect even those with whom we disagree." This is something we seem to have forgotten.

These are just some excerpts, but the article spoke to me it is worth the read.

Highlights from March 28, 2023

If you did not make our March meeting then you missed out on some great information from our Precinct 8 Constable, Phil Sandlin and Sergeant Anthony Ferraro from the Support Services Division.



With 31 years of experience under his belt, you can rest assured our community is in good hands with our Constable and the [Precinct 8 Command Staff](#). Keeping our families safe and protecting our streets are the top priorities.

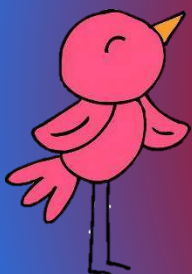
Did you know Precinct 8 is approximately 150 square miles and is the home of some amazing landmarks such as: the Pasadena Industrial District, Fred Hartman Bridge, Sylvan Beach, Lynchburg Ferry, San Jacinto Monument, Space Center Houston, NASA, Armand Bayou Nature Center and many beautiful parks. Precinct 8 also has 12 municipalities.

Constable Sandlin gave us some stats and general information on what happens in our community.

- Road Rage on the toll roads - 2 to 3 times weekly
- Burglary of motor vehicles, in particular Chevy Trucks (F250) are the #1 stolen vehicles. Most vehicles are broken into by using a "Car Widow Punch" tool. The local refineries and malls are high target areas.
- There is an average of 14 guns a week confiscated from stolen vehicles. The office sends all guns to a ballistics lab to determine if there is involvement in any other crimes. Most guns come from the black market.
- The theft of Catalytic Converters is not as common as before. The price of this has now declined.
- Fentanyl is making its way thru our community. Constable Phil told of us a story of 8 recent fentanyl deaths in Precinct 8.
- Precinct 8 has a team of undercover constables for patrolling higher areas of concern including Baybrook Mall, El Camino Real and 45 South and Edgebrook areas.
- Harris County continues to lead in DWI deaths. Most occur on the toll roads. The precinct has an accident reconstruction team to decipher the alcohol, speeding and running of red light accidents.
- Constable Sandlin warned our members of phone scams and cybercrimes. The scammers usually target people of 70 years+.

He also mentioned the "Grizzly's Hood News" (www.facebook.com/GrizzysHoodNews/). If there is news happening anywhere in Houston, there is posting of videos or photos from the thousands of followers, known as the "Hood News Peeps" on Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and TikTok.

I could not cover in detail the entire presentation and discussion. To learn more about Constable Phil and the amazing work his office is doing go to the [Harris County Precinct 8 website](#). It is full of valuable resources, information and links.

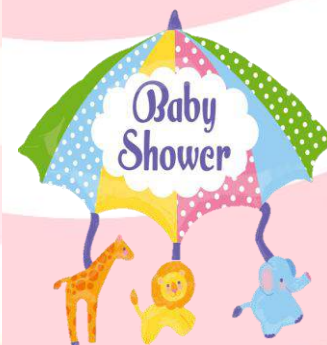

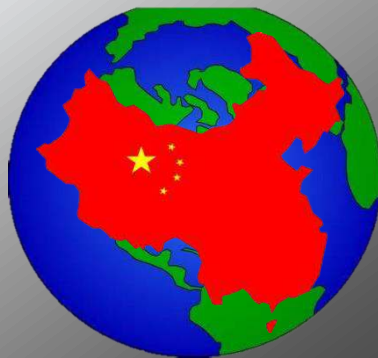

Definition of Doublethink

In 1984, the Party used **doublethink** as part of its large-scale campaign of propaganda and psychological manipulation of its leadership and the public. **Doublethink** is the ability to hold two completely contradictory beliefs at the same time and to believe they are both true. Early in the book, doublethink refers to the ability to control your memories, to choose to forget something, as well as to forget about the forgetting process. Later on in the novel, as the Party implements its mind-control techniques, people ultimately lose the ability to form independent thoughts. Eventually, it becomes possible for the Party to convince the public of anything, even if it's the exact opposite of what the public already knows to be true.

Orwell defines doublethink as, *To know and to not know, to be conscious of complete truthfulness while telling carefully constructed lies, to hold simultaneously two opinions which cancelled out, knowing them to be contradictory and believing in both of them, to use logic against logic, to repudiate morality while laying claim to it, to believe that democracy is impossible and that the Party was the guardian of democracy. To forget, whatever it was necessary to forget, then to draw it back into memory again at the moment when it was*

Postmodernism

What is postmodernism?

[Postmodernism](#) is a late 20th-century movement in philosophy and literary theory that generally questions the basic assumptions of [Western philosophy](#) in the modern period (roughly, the 17th century through the 19th century).

What are some general characteristics of postmodernism?

Postmodern philosophy is characterized by broad [skepticism](#) or [relativism](#) and a general suspicion of [reason](#). It also broadly asserts that Western intellectual and cultural norms and values are a product of, or are in some sense influenced by, the ideology of dominant or elite groups and at least indirectly serve their interests.

What do postmodernists believe?

Many postmodernists hold one or more of the following views:

- (1) there is no objective reality;
- (2) there is no scientific or historical truth (objective [truth](#));
- (3) science and technology (and even [reason](#) and [logic](#)) are not vehicles of human progress but suspect instruments of established power;
- (4) reason and logic are not universally valid;
- (5) there is no such thing as [human nature](#) ([human behavior](#) and [psychology](#) are socially determined or constructed);
- (6) [language](#) does not refer to a reality outside itself;
- (7) there is no certain knowledge; and
- (8) no general theory of the natural or social world can be valid or true (all are illegitimate “metanarratives”).

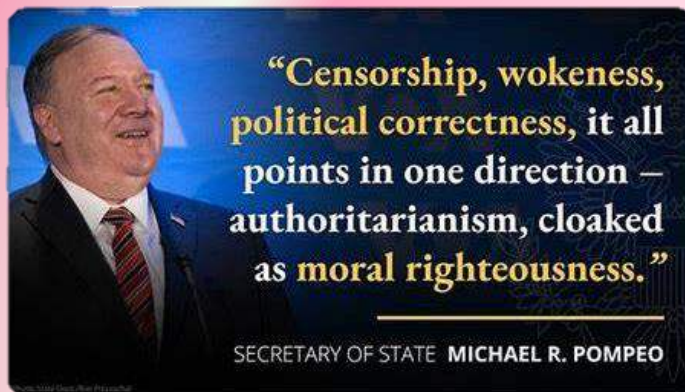

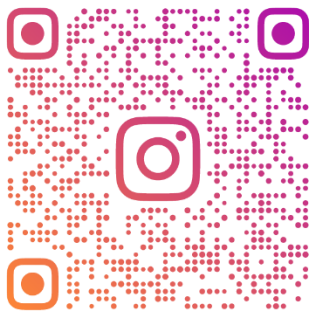
